The Hutchinson stopper was invented in 1879 by Charles G. Hutchinson. The stopper consists of four parts: a pull wire, and a rubber disc sandwiched between two metal washers. When you pull up on the wire, the rubber disc is forced into the neck of the bottle forming a seal. If you want to read more about the Hutchinson stopper, I highly recommend the web site:




