Donnie Medlin's Rare "5 Cap" Cone Top

It gets it's name from the five caps pictured around the can. One like it sold for \$2700.00 at an auction in Iowa. The two above are nice single dot and double dot cans.

The nice amber Pepsi from Memphis, Tennessee, shown on the left, was presented by Charlie Perry. The script *Pepsi Cola* on the base and the block letter Pepsi Cola on the shoulder makes this a difficult bottle to find.
