Figural Mini Whiskeys A SMALL NEW WORLD FOR THE BOTTLE COLLECTOR

During the 50's and 60's my brother-in-law was a mechanic for Delta Airlines. While working in the cabin area of the plane he would occasionally run across a mini whiskey bottle. Knowing my interest in bottles he would pass them on to me. During those years I put together a collection of forty or so full, glass mini bottles.

In the mid 80's, while on vacation in Scotland, my wife and I stopped for lunch at a local Pub. When entering the door you could turn left into the bar or right into the restaurant. Straight ahead was a wall with a large bulletin board where the locals could post their "FOR SALE" items. One of the notes immediately caught my eye... '*Mini Whiskey Bottles For Sale'*. The waitress, who happened to be the wife of the owner, was a friend of the person selling the bottles. After a brief phone call a lady showed up with a large box of mini whiskeys. She had worked as a flight attendant for British Airlines and had collected the bottles from all over the world. After a short negotiation I ended up with the collection. Once the sale was complete everyone joined in and individually wrapped each bottle to guarantee safe travel back to the U.S. This unusual purchase increased my collection to about 150 mini whiskeys.

During my career at IBM I had the opportunity to travel to Scotland, England, Japan, Canada, and areas throughout the U.S. On each trip I would return home with a few more mini bottles. My collection slowly grew to about 300 bottles.

In 2007 I was assisting a family with an estate liquidation. While searching through an inner closet we found over three hundred mini whiskeys neatly packed away. Needless to say, I ended up with this collection. My collection quickly sky rocketed to over 700. All of the bottles in my collection are made of glass and are full, except for evaporation loss. <u>All have their original seal and range between 3 and 5 inches tall.</u>

My personal favorites are the mini figurals. The following photos will primarily be figurals with a few others thrown in because of their interesting or unusual label. I hope you enjoy seeing these unusual whiskeys as much as I enjoyed collecting them.

Scotland is a premier place for the mini bottle collector. They produce a wide variety of beautiful figural mini bottles.






