


Raleigh Bottle Club Newsletter



WHO, WHEN AND WHERE

Club President David Tingen was the featured speaker during the January meeting. Dave's presentation dealt with bottle identification based on the base or bottom embossing. Dave brought along several bottles from his collection to use as illustrations. Very often the shape or style of a bottle defines how the bottle was used and also determines the industry name assigned to that shape and style.





If the date code has a dot beside the single digit number, it is a 40's bottle. If there is no dot, it is a 30's bottle. The charts and information come from a 2004 Bottles and Extras Magazine. The article "The Dating Game" was written by Bill Lockhart. I suggest you search the internet for this well written and very informative article..






