Rare Smithville, N.C. Half Pint Slug Plate Milks From Vernon Creech's Collection

The two bottles on each end are Stevens's Dairy bottles. The bottle in the middle is from Booker's Dairy. The different slug plate embossing make them unique and rare. L to R....The first bottle slug plate is embossed RAW AND PASTEURIZED. The second bottle only reads PASTEURIZED. The Booker's Dairy bottle in the middle reads GRADE A MILK. The fourth bottle has the four digit phone number embossed in the slug plate. The fifth bottle has the words RAW MILK in the slug plate. A subtle change in the embossing can mean a large difference in the value of the bottle; so look at your bottles carefully. Put them side by side and look for any differences.





These two nice Pepsi pieces are owned by club secretary, Robert Creech. The calendar is a very nice and colorful piece of Pepsi history from 1948. The book cover was an early 50's promotional piece that lasted only a short time. If you remember these, you should be on Social Security.

WHAT'S IN YOUR ATTIC ? Corn Whiskey and Apple Brandy




About a year ago I got a call from a man who had some whiskey and wine bottles for sale. These bottles had been thrown through an opening into an attic covered with about six inches of rock wool insulation. Most of the bottles had little value except for an extremely rare Old Speas Apple Brandy. He told me there were more bottles in the attic and, of course, my curiosity was killing me. I called him several times over the next three months and he would always say, "I ain't had time to get back in the attic". After three months I gave up calling, expecting never to hear from him again. About two months ago my phone rang and the old gentleman wanted me to come by. He had found about sixty more bottles. Most of the bottles were duplicates of those I got earlier but, as I strongly hoped, there was another Speas Apple Brandy in the bunch. Finding one of these is almost unheard of. Finding two is a minor miracle. Another very nice bottle in this bunch was a Tar Heel Corn Whiskey. When I saw the label I felt sure it was a North Carolina product and was surprised to find it was bottled in Illinois. I would bet a ham biscuit it has North Carolina ties somewhere along the way. Why else would the label have the image of a moonshiner's car, a tobacco barn, and a mule. There had to have been a Tarheel in the wood pile somewhere.




