


The Old Colony tin store sign and the two nice thermometers were presented at "show and tell" by RBC Secretary, Robert Creech. The old 24 slot Pepsi crate from Durham, N.C. was shown by Sterling Mann. Sterling seems to have the inside scoop on finding the rare old soda crates.



Pepsi Guru, Donnie Medlin, presented four rare and unusual Pepsi throw-away bottles. I am always amazed at the next thing I see coming from the collection of Donnie Medlin. Just when you think you have seen it all, along comes something else even more fascinating and unusual. The three plastic throw-away bottles (16 oz.-10oz-10oz) on your left are extremely rare.

The bottle on the right is believed to be a prototype plastic Pepsi bottle. The odd top hat shaped area at the top was used in the manufacturing process. Notice the <u>hole</u> in the side of the 'top hat'. Air was blown into the opening during the manufacturing stage forcing the liquid plastic into the bottle mold to form the shape of the bottle. The 'top hat' was then <u>cut away</u> leaving the finish bottle.
