




Rare W.B. Mann gallon whiskey jug from Jack Murdock's collection



On the right you will see Jack Murdock's mini mug....Many years ago.







The postmark on this letter reads April 19, 1918 which was just after the death of Drewry Parker, cofounder of Pepsi-Cola in Henderson. This is a great piece of early Pepsi history. 









The bottles pictured on this page are over 130 years old and are extremely rare. There are very few bottles embossed "HILLSBORO, N.C. and all are very collectible but these two are head and shoulders above the others. The top bottle is a pint owned by Donnie Medlin. The bottle on the bottom is a quart owned by Joe Williams. Thanks to Donnie and Joe for giving us a chance to see these nice bottles from Colonial Hillsboro (now spelled Hillsborough).

Other Collectible Hillsboro bottles:

Hillsboro Dairy milk bottles. Noxall soda, Taka-Kola soda, Hobbleskirt Coke and straight side Coke (may be color variances).











You are looking at a rare Millville half pint canning jar from RBC member Joe Williams' collection. This is an unusual jar. The pint jar mold was cut off at the bottom to reduce the mold to half pint. When the jar was molded in the cut down mold the normal oval embossing "Whitehalls Paten" became "hitalls Paten". Jar collectors are very familiar with this mold alteration and are always on the lookout for this unusual jar. The jar has the correct cast metal yoke clamp with the thumbscrew that is marked Whitall's Patent June 18th, 1861. If you see one of these for under \$300.00 you might be wise to buy it......or call Joe.


READER FEEDBACK

As promised, here are some recent photos and historical information about the original Pepsi-Cola plant in downtown Henderson, N.C.

In the early 1900's Drewry L. Parker was a liquor bottler in the Henderson area. He later decided to venture into the flavored soft drink business. Sidney J. Lane, who trained under Marvin Burnett, Pepsi bottler in Durham around 1908-09, joined forces with Parker to bring Pepsi-Cola to Henderson in early 1910. Parker died in 1917 and Lane took over the total operation. Lane moved the business one block down the street into a new Pepsi-Cola plant in 1920. Lane's son, Sidney, Jr., joined the business after graduation from UNC in 1923. Around the same time Lane dropped Pepsi-Cola. (due to Pepsi-Cola Companies bankruptcy) and picked up the Chero-Cola and Nehi Cola brands. The picture below shows the original Pepsi-Cola plant in Henderson, N.C. Pepsi-Cola has long been gone but the building is still being used today.

I have also included a photo of the original Burlington, N.C. Pepsi-Cola plant. It was the first Pepsi plant building in N.C., circa 1908. It was originally operated by J. Zeb Waller. Zeb was elected as the first president of the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF PEPSI BOTTLERS at the Pepsi-Cola Company's third annual bottler meeting held in New Bern, N.C. in January, 1912.
