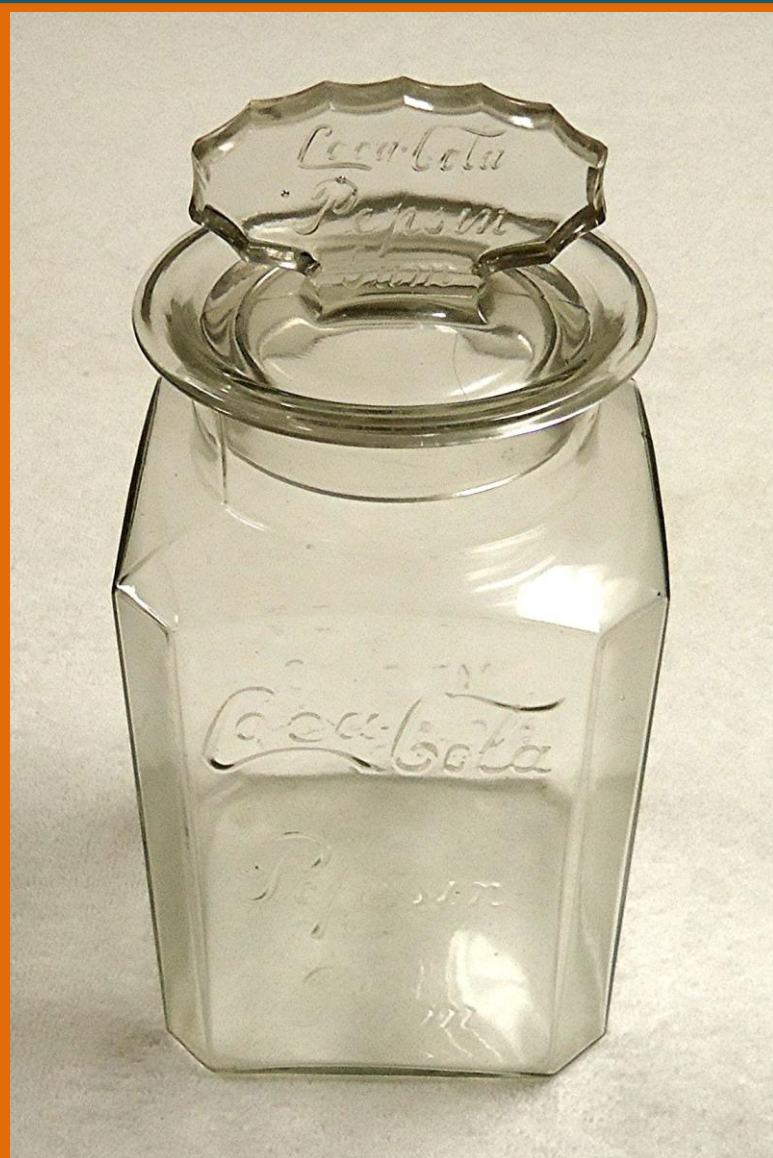

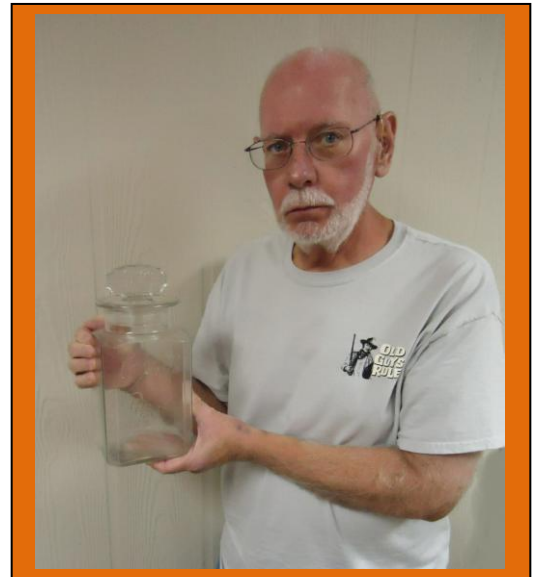


1914 Coca-Cola Pepsin Gum Jar with the original from the collection of RBC member Tom Walsh

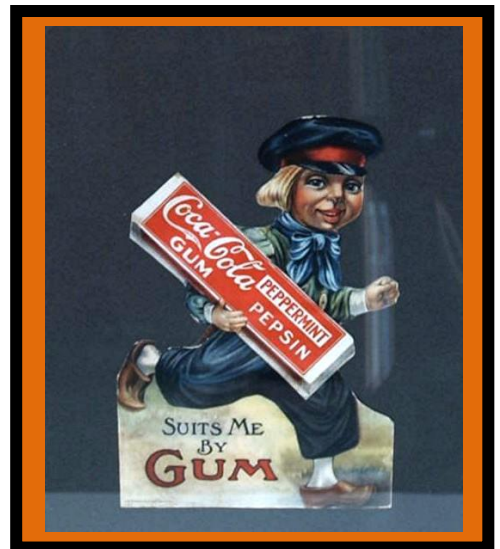

If you only have the jar, expect to deal out another two or three hundred dollars for an authentic lid. The ad shown below shows the chewing gum that was sold from these jars. If you want the chewing gum to go with your jar, you might want to start saving your money. The gum might very well have more value than the jar and the lid.

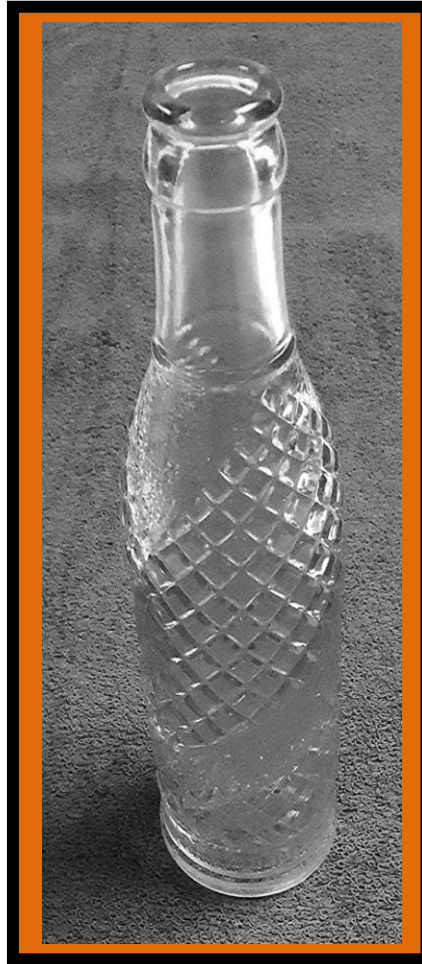

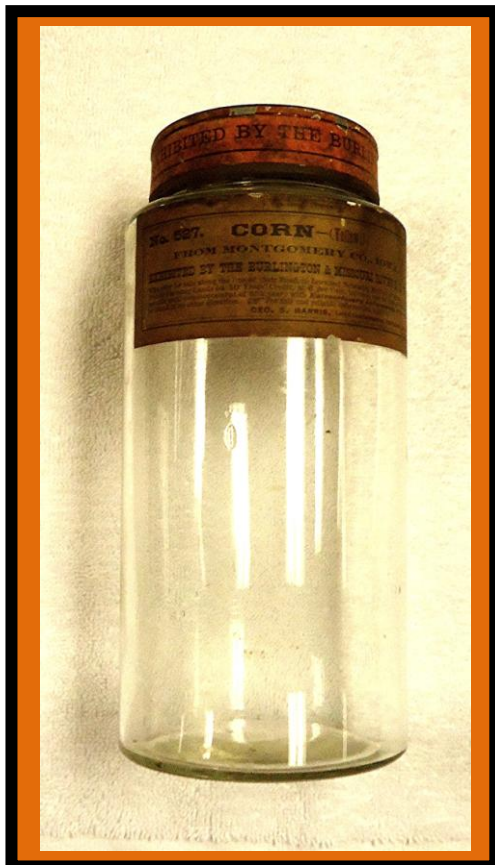

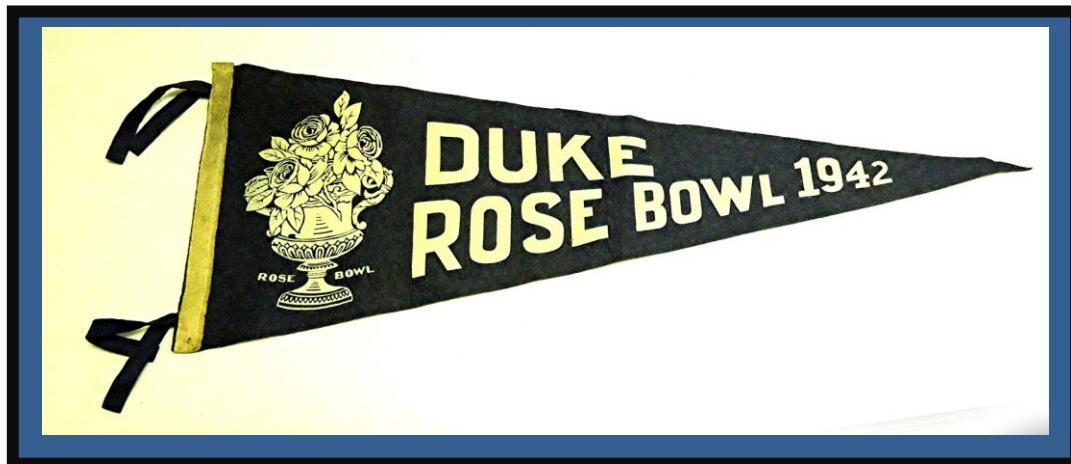
Items from Jack Murdock's Sports Memorabilia Collection

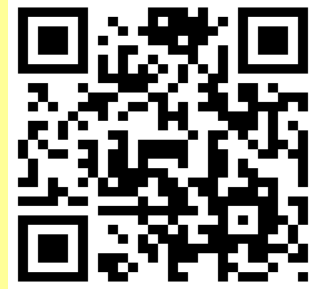

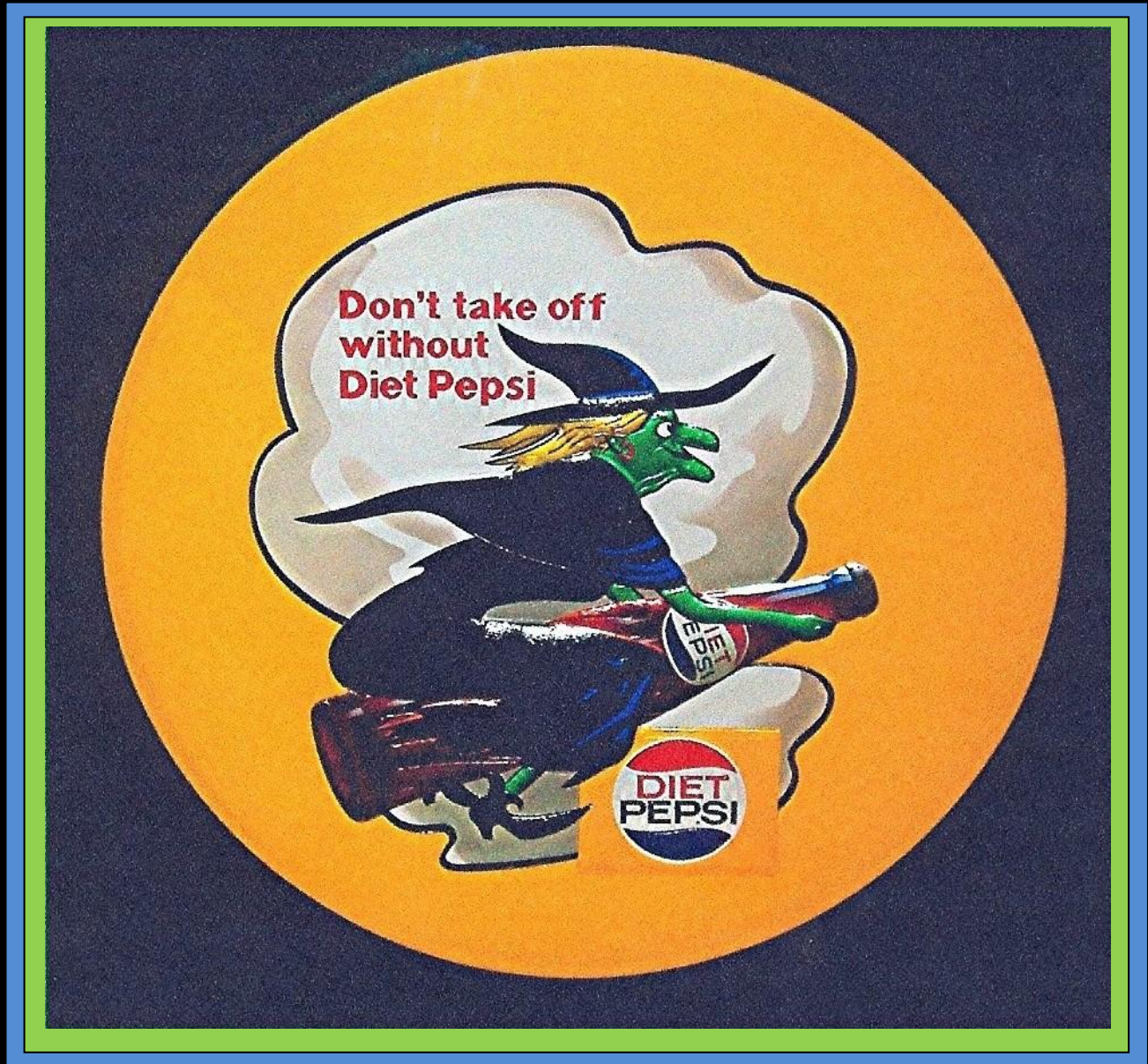
