




SCHAFER & VATER GIVEAWAYS

BOTTLES, FLASKS & DECANTERS

The German porcelain company of Schafer & Vater manufactured many types of functional yet whimsical, sometimes satirical bottles, flasks and decanters in addition to many other figurines, match holders, ash pots, vases, incense burners and other forms. The bottles were made primarily for the American market just prior to and during the US Prohibition Era. Pieces were marketed to bars, cafes, restaurants, liquor dealers and fraternal organizations...really any entity that wanted to use novelty items for promotional purposes.... Giveaways, if you will.

Schafer & Vater produced very high quality porcelain pieces in a multitude of glaze colors including a life-like multicolor glaze, brown & white glaze, pink & white and the blue & white glaze displayed here today. They also used several 2color and 3-color jasperware finishes. The blue & white glazes have always had the highest appeal to giveaway collectors ...however, I collect all the various glaze colors, forms, and sizes. The watermark seen on this poster is the S&V corporate seal impressed on the bottom of many pieces.






On Saturday night the Glass Works Auction got off to a good start with the first bottle selling for \$7500.00. There were 105 items auctioned bringing over \$70,000.00. It was amazing to me to see people bidding hundreds of dollars on a bottle and from their appearance you would think they might need help with their next meal.. The nicer bottles seem to hold their value so I guess it's not a bad long term investment . There is one thing you must keep in mind when you purchase a bottle. When you drop five one hundred dollar bills you can pick them up and you still have \$500.00 but if you drop a \$500.00 bottleOh well, you know the answer. The next few pages are from the Glass Works catalogue. The sale price for each item has been penciled in to give you a better idea of what types of bottles demand a premium price.

"LOUIS KOSSUTH"/BUST OF KOSSUTH AND FLAGS - "U.S. STEAM FRIGATE / MISSISSIPPI', (GI-112a), probably made for Samuel Hullsey of Philadelphia at the Isabella Glass Works, Brooklyn, New Jersey, ca. 1851 - 1853, aqua calabash, "PH DOFLEIN/MOULD MAKER /NTH, ST 84" embossed on the base, open ponit applied blob mouth. An area of light milky inside haze exits, otherwise in perfect condition, and with an exceptional impression. This is the ravest, and probably the earliest of the two variations of the Kossuth / Fingate calabesh. Ex. Roy Brown Collection. #33). Estimated Value 5000 (\$600.00 - 800.00)

76. "OLD SACHEM / BITTERS / AND / WIGWAM TONIC", (Ring/Ham, O-46), New York, ca. 1865 - 1875, copper topsz barrel, 9 1/4°h, smooth base, applied mouth. Several very liny surface imperfections exist. Attractive and unusual color.

77. "OLD SACHEM / BITTERS / AND / WIGWAM TONIC", (Ring/ Ham, O-46), New York, ca. 1855 - 1865, amber barrel, 9 3/8"h, open pontil, applied mouth. A tiny sand grain below the letter "N" in "TONIC" has a slight radiation around it. Also some scratches. Very few pontiled examples exist.

78. Snuff Bottle, "A. DELPIT / NO. 16 / ST. LOUIS ST. / NEW ORLEANS", Louisiana, ca. 1840 - 1860, yellow amber, 4 1/2"h, iron pontiled, tool flared out lip. A tiny flake is off the edge of the base. Lightly cleaned to its original luster. Highly whittled glass, brilliant almost pure yellow color. Most known examples were dug in or around New Orleans. Many have condition issues, and only a very few, if any, are as nice as this one.


79. "PAROLE / PURE (Standing Horse) RYE/WHISKEY", (Dervin, PAR-21). American, ca. 1875 - 1880, orange amber quart, 10 1/8/h, smooth base, applied double collar mouth. Cleaned to its original luster, but retains a number of imperfections. mostly in the form of small scratches. Parole was toaled in 1873 at the Rancocas Stable in New Jarsey, From 1877 through 1879 Parole won 10 major stakes races, including the prestigious Saratoga Cup, won in both 1877 and 1878. He raced for 12 years winning 59 of his 138 starts. Parole clied in 1903. In 1964 he was inducted into the National Museum of Racing, Hall of Fame. 00. Estimated Value 160 (\$275.00 - 475.00)

80. "DR. J. HOSTETTER'S / STOMACH BITTERS", (Ring/ Ham, H-194), Pennsylvania, ca. 1870 - 1980, medium yellow green, 9 1/8°h, "A.M.C C & CO / A" on smooth base, applied tapered collar mouth. A pinhead size flake is off a corner at the base. A tiny open surface bubble is on the shoulder. Brilliant color, attic found condition and the mentioned flaws are mentioned mostly for accuracy. 

Some outside glass duliness and interior diod contents. One of the earliest Champagne bottles. Nots the flarged out ip for lying the cork with a string or copper wire.

41. Strapsided Whiskey Flask, American, ca. 1875 - 1890, deep vivid obelt blue quart, 9 1/27h, "F" on smooth base, double applied collar mouth. Some minor scratches, but no form of damage. Considered by many to be the rareat and most sought after of all the strapsidod whiskey flasks, doe Zano Collection.

Dr. Cornwell was in business from 1896 to 1897 et 1209 - 1210 North Broadway in St. Louis. Extremely rate, possibly less than the are known to exist!


44. Large Storage Kidney Form Demijohn, European, ca. 1870 - 1885. yellowish olive green, 19 1,4 h, riple pontil scarred basis, applied tapered collar mouth, blown in a two part mold. Some light inside heze. It's known that the European Glass Houses pontled many of there bolles years after the Anterican House no longer did. The three confil scars on the base may have been created as an experiment that could have involved a type of three pronged floor stand to hold the bottle while the lip was being applied. Whatever the reason, we have not een anything like it before. Estimated Value (\$180.00 - 250.00) 200"







 Handled Whiskey, "J.B. WILDER & CO. / LOUISVILLE, KY", (unlisted), Kentucky, ca. 1860 - 1870, amber drum form, 8 1/8"h, smooth base, applied mouth and handle. Perfect condition, crude pebbly glass and plenty of bubbles. To cur knowledge this is the only known example!



 "DR. TOWNSEND'S -SARSAPARILLA - ALBANY / N.Y.", (Odell, pg. 349), New York, ca. 1840 - 1860, mecium blue green, 9 1/2"n, iron pontil, applied tapered collar mouth. A faint 1/8" bruise is on the outer edge of the lip. Nice glass whitle, full pontil. Frank Bruce Collection.

An open bubble exists on top of the lip, otherwise perfect. A very rare bottle, especially with the highly graphic, and original labels.



The two bottles shown here are from Whitt Stallings' collection. The one on the left is a quart Underwood ink bottle with a pour spout. These were sometimes called "schoolmaster" inks. The schoolmaster would use this large bottle to fill up the desk inkwells before classes began.

The center slug plate Coca Cola bottle from WILSON, NORTH CAROLINA is rare and highly sought after by local collectors.







This Biltmore milk bottle would probably not draw a lot of attention except for the unusual message embossed on the side..."WASH ME, DON'T BORROW ME OR STEAL ME". Very often a bottle that is a little unusual in color or embossing becomes a real collectible item. I think you will have to agree this bottle is a little unusual. The bottle is from Whitt Stallings' collection.

TOP: This nice cobalt blue J. COSGROVE soda bottle from Charleston, SC was brought by Whit Stallings. This is a very nice bottle and should sell for well over \$100.00.

RIGHT: Whit Stallings also brought this nice blob top E.B. GARDNER from Elmira, NY. This bottle is valued at about 12 to 15 dollars depending on condition. It has little or no collector value in this part of NC.









A couple of months ago someone brought this attractive Cooper's Apple Brandy bottle to "Show and Tell". The beautifully designed label on this amber bottle really makes it stand out. Since it is from the small town of Marion, NC it is all the more attractive to collectors. I have seen several Cooper's Apple Brandy bottles but until now they were all pints. If you have one of a different size or color, please email me a photo. The pint clear glass bottle sells for about \$35.00 depending on condition.
